### **A Resolution Creating the Craig Valley Railroad Bed Committee and Appointing its Chairman and Members**

**WHEREAS**, the citizens in Craig County currently enjoy a one mile walking trail along the old Craig Valley Railroad Bed near New Castle , and

**WHEREAS**, the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) recently completed a survey of the entire length of old Craig Valley Railroad Bed, consisting of 25.9 miles of railroad bed that has been identified as eligible for a walking trail project in Craig and Botetourt counties, with the current one mile Craig County portion being the only completed section, and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors recognizes the outdoor recreational benefits of a 25.9 mile walking trail starting in New Castle and ending in Eagle Rock, with a total of 8.8 miles being located in Craig County, and

**WHEREAS**, the need to establish a Craig Valley Railroad Bed Committee to provide well informed guidance and recommendations for the development of a trail project for the recreational and health benefits of Craig County citizens, to the Craig County Board of Supervisors, and

**WHEREAS**, the County needs to identify various sources of state support for project partnerships as well as private funding for the Pre Engineering and Planning, and eventually the construction of the Craig - Botetourt Trail , and

**WHEREAS**, the County needs to review and utilize the programs available at the Virginia Department of Transportation, and the Commonwealth of Virginia, that could provide critical funding to the County which lacks project investment capital, and

**WHEREAS**, the County needs to identify low cost segments of the project for cost effectiveness and an increased likelihood of providing walking trails to the citizens of Craig County, and

**WHEREAS**, the Craig - Botetourt Trail would increase tourism activates in Craig County, and

**WHEREAS**, the Craig Valley Railroad Bed Committee would engage the citizens of Craig County by scheduling Citizen Information Meetings, and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors wishes to appoint a Craig Valley Railroad Bed Committee consisting of SEVEN (7) members which will review and identify options enabling the Committee to make well-informed recommendations, to address the outdoor recreational needs of the County and the Craig - Botetourt Trail project, to the Board of Supervisors, and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Supervisors of Craig County hereby confirms and appoints the Chairman and Members of the newly formed Craig Valley Railroad Bed Committee:

**WHEREAS**, the Craig County Board of Supervisors (CCBoS) adopted the 2021-2022 Budget on May 6, 2021 for planning purposes, and

**WHEREAS**, the Craig Co Emergency Services has received monies for Donations \$100 which will be used for equipment and also received the amount of \$2114 from four life funds to be used for medical supplies, and

**WHEREAS**, the Public Safety Department has received additional funds over and beyond the budgeted amount for the FY22 four for life in the amount of \$157. The FY 22 total amount of four for life is \$6,343 and will be distributed between the CCRS, Paint Bank Rescue and CCEMS, and they have also received additional amount of funding in the Aid to Localities in the amount of 10,000 these ATL funds will be distributed to the volunteer fire departments, and

**WHEREAS**, the clerk of the circuit court has received a grant for records processing from the Commonwealth of Virginia, Compensation Board in the amount of \$24,275 this will be used for filming documents, they have also received from the compensation board an additional \$1,000 in technology funding for their records processing, and

**WHEREAS**, the Craig County Department of Social Services has also received additional funds in the amount of \$15,000 from the Commonwealth of Virginia for Title IV-E Adoption Study, this will be added to the Department of Social Services budget with no local funding needed, and

**WHEREAS**, the Craig County Sheriff Dept has received the amount of \$375 in state seizure funding, this will be used for supplies and cost for the sheriff office which are designated by seizure funds, now

**A Resolution  
 Establishing the Flood Plain Policy (FPP)  
 For the County of Craig Building Official**

**WHEAREAS**, this policy is adopted for the sole purpose of providing an acceptable level of safety to all individuals, homeowners, property owners, business owners, and the general public, and

**WHEAREAS**, The Flood Plain Policy (FPP) will limit loss and or damage to private property which has, or will, experiences a flood plain event, incident, or occurrence, and

**WHEAREAS**, any building or structure, either erected or established in a flood plain area, OR a suspected flood plain area, within the County of Craig shall be required to obtain a certificate of elevation from a Professional Engineer (PE) or a Licensed Surveyor showing:

1. FEMA - Flood Plain Level Elevation
2. Establish First Floor Construction Level - at Flood Plain Level **PLUS** one foot (12 inches).

**WHEAREAS**, all electrical equipment, heat pumps, or other equipment serving the structure shall be at or above the “Establish First Floor Construction Level. No basement is permitted in a FEMA flood plain area. This certificate shall be issued prior to the building permit and will be a required attachment to any Building Permit issued in a FEMA Flood Plain area, and

**WHEAREAS**, any building or structure in place prior to the effective date listed shall be accepted as having been “Grandfathered” and shall not be subject to this requirement. However, any building or structure which is torn down, destroyed, or removed, may be replaced, once all requirements of the Flood Plain Policy and the Building Code have been met.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the Craig County Flood Plain Policy is hereby adopted, effective July 1, 2022.

### **REPORTS AND INQUIRIES FROM THE BOARD**

- a. Health Department Lease- Mr. Collins updated the board on the current lease that has been in place for the last 15 years which expires June 30, 2022. Mr. Collins suggested extending the lease at it's current rate for the next 3 months while negotiating a new lease. – ARAP funds eligible for Radio Project. We submitted a VDEM grant request for \$2,900,000.00 last month. In addition, contacted Delegate (Both Joe McNamara & Terry Austin) there may be state funding available. Delegate Austin is on the House Appropriations Committee.
- b. ARAP Funds (approximately \$999,500+/-) are eligible for the Radio Project. We submitted a VDEM grant request for \$2,900,000.00 last month. In addition, contacted Delegate (Both Joe McNamara & Terry Austin) there may be state funding available. Delegate Austin is on the House Appropriations Committee.
- c. Opioid Settlement-Notified that the County will receive \$371,000. Not sure of eligible uses. All proceeds will go into General Fund – Fund Balance.
- d. Planning Commission will be reviewing a proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment addressing "Accessory Apartments" (Guest House) this Spring. The

purpose is to allow a small dwelling for and immediate family member, on a single lot in various zones. Updating the county Comprehensive Plan will also start this May or June.

- e. Dam #1- Continued efforts with Senator Steve Newman and Delegates Joe McNamara and Terry Austin (Our new Delegate) to fund the “Local Match” for Johns Creek Dam No. 1 Federal safety modifications. Receive notification federal funding, along with the State (Local) matching funds has been approved. No County funds needed.
- f. GIS update- the Registrar has asked that we consider including a voting precinct in the Magisterial District overlay. Will discuss with Hurt & Proffitt.
- g. Landfill- We have advertised landfill Property for sale once again, R/W to be recorded in the Clerk’s Office prior to any possible sale.
- h. Rails to Trails- IN PROGRESS VDOT has completed the first review for developing a Walking/Bike/Horse Trail from New Castle to Eagle Rock in Botetourt County. The next step is the Preliminary Engineering work. Part of the work is to have several Citizen Information Meetings (CIM) to provide the public an opportunity to review and discuss. I recommend the Board appoint a 5-member committee to oversee the development and insure citizen involvement. The Committee should include a representative for the Tourism Commission, National Forest, Field of Dreams, and two others. I would recommend the County Administer be an Ex-official. A Resolution appointing the committee will be prepared for the June Agenda. If you know of anyone interested in serving, please let me know. I would recommend that eh Tourism Committee be the lead group for the project. “Craig Valley Rail bed Survey” report distributed at the April 9, 2022 meeting. Will place proposed committee on the June Meeting Agenda.
