BRIEFINGS

- A. Brian Bevins, VDOT No Land Development and 2 private entrances (April thru May). No traffic Engineering work order was submitted. Mowing Sinking Creek area and brush cleaning when necessary. Ditching and Pipe cleaning, pipe replacement on Route 621 Upper Craig Valley Drive/Pip inventory throughout county. Patching on Route 621 Upper Craig Creek. Grading and stone as needed. Patching on 311 (Craig Valley Drive/Paint Bank Road) Completed projects, pipe replacement: Route 1007 (Yoder Street). Mow trimming on Routes 609 (Sand Plant Road)., 614 (Hawkins Lane / Cedar Rush Road / Camp Easter Seals Road), 624 (Little Mountain Road), and 626 (Bethel Church Road) in progress. Cleaned pipe and ditches Paint Bank area. Route 311 (New Castle) Bridge Replacement over Meadow Creek (UPC 112877), project was accepted May 1,2023, ahead of the contract completion date of May 25,2023. The Structure is 0.70 miles from Route 611 and 9010 miles from Allegheny County Line.
- B. Trace Bellassai, Broadband- no update
- C. Bill Wolfe, Preserve Craig County, Mountain Valley Pipeline If this was last week this would be good news, no plan for construction going forward. Because MVP is missing federal and state permits for water crossing and biological opinion being disputed in Court. Two decisions in court in our favor, Preserve Craig was a litigant, and for the first time ruled, serious question regarding viability for project and FERC permit renewal was not adequately addressed since last renewal. However, over the weekend the bill to settle the debt ceiling limit, four pages addition, 95,96,97,98 of the 99 page bill. A copy is given to you, was dedicated to the completion of MVP. Sec. 233. Permitting Streamlining for energy Storage and specially Sec. 324, expedient MVP. Senator Kaine asked to amend, Speaker of the house denied him. Mr. Wolf reviewed with the board each section. No further judicial review will occur, only in the DC Courts and all permits will be cleared with no issues in 21 days. We will address constitutional issues but will not be time enough before MVP is completed. This may be the last time I come to update on MVP. We will continue the Mountain Valley Watch which was the process of looking at the construction and reporting to the DEO regarding caves that have been caved in, houses washed away, fish that have died, washed out creeks and over 600 violations. I appreciate the Boards support over the last eight years for those who oppose this project and for those of you in the room, where Mountain Valley Pipeline Representatives were here and promised to come to the board regularly report to the board and answer questions. That promise is as broken as the rest of the project. That is what I must report. The Board requested a letter to be sent immediately in opposition of Mountain Valley Pipeline to Senator Kaine and Senator Warner.

D. Woody Lipps, Chairman, Craig Valley Railbed Scenic Trail Update-Mr. Lipps thanked the Board for their time. Today marks the first anniversary of when our formation of our Railbed committee. Thank you for asking me to participate in this process. It is a challenge and rewarding. On May 24th we held our monthly meeting and we had two residences along the trail that joined us in discussion to air their concerns and we shared information. We completed one additional site visit, reviewed adjacent properties with owners, and discussed issues and concerns. Two more site visits are scheduled in the near future. VDOT is continuing to gather field data and continue survey. Open house meetings are scheduled to start September. Section of Mill Creek looks to be in use and somewhat maintained. Attended recent Commonwealth Transportation Board Public hearing. And building public participation in the process.

RESOLUTION APPROVING VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SECONDARY SYSTEM SIX-YEAR PLAN FOR CRAIG COUNTY FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 THROUGH 2028-2029

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Craig County, Virginia in cooperation with the Virginia Department of Transportation conducted a public hearing on June 1st, 2023 regarding the proposed Secondary System Six-Year Plan for Fiscal Years 2023-2024 through 2028-2029 (July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2029) for Craig County, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors and the Department of Transportation received public comment and input at the aforementioned public hearing on the proposed Six-Year Plan, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors wishes to proceed with approval of the Secondary System Six-Year Plan for Craig County for Fiscal Years 2023-2024 through 2028-2029.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Craig County that the Secondary System Six-Year Plan for Fiscal Years 2023-2024 through 2028-2029 and the same is hereby approved.

The Board of Supervisors of Craig County, in a regular meeting held on the 1^{st} , day of June 2023 adopted this resolution.

Mr. Spence asked for a motion on R23-48 Approving the Virginia Department of Transportation Secondary System Six Year Plan. Mr. Dunbar made a motion, seconded by Mr. Matyas. Mr. Zimmerman, yes, Mr. Matyas, yes, Mr. Dunbar, yes, Mr. Bailey, yes, and Mr. Spence, yes.

Discussion with VDOT on quality of work throughout the county and adhering to time commitments.

REPORTS AND INQUIRIES FROM THE BOARD

- 1. **EDA** Vacancies open on the Economic Development Authority. Submitted the AFID Infrastructure Grant Program (\$50,000) and the T-Mobil Grant (\$25,000) applications for the Farmers Market April 1st. Funding from local sources has been approved. Using the State of Virginia contract services, we have a **Construction Quote of \$149,701.02** for Phase one of the Farmers Market Project. Since the State met the procurement requirements, we don't have to bid the work. Work should begin late June or early July.
- 2. **ARAP Funds** (Approximately \$996,637+/-) are eligible for Radio project. In addition, Delegate Terry Austin reports that there is \$1,000,000 proposed in the State Budget. We will submit a VDEM grant request for \$3,900,000 next month.
- 3. **Opioid Settlement** Notified that the County will receive \$371,000. An eligible expense is assisting with the funding of the Catawba Hospital expansion currently being considered by the State Legislature.
- 4. **2024 Reassessment** —Wampler Eanes Appraisal Group LTD has been working on the reassessments for the last few months **74%** of all parcels have been assessed. All assessments are scheduled to be completed by October 1, 2023. The Assessors are to have signs on both sides of their vehicle, and an ID to present to Landowners while on their property.
- 5. Rails To Trails IN PROGRESS VDOT has completed the first review. The next step is the Preliminary Engineering work. CTB provided \$1,000,000 for PE work at their October Meeting. The Board appointed a 7-member committee at the June Meeting to oversee the development and ensure citizen involvement. An update will be presented to the Board of Supervisors at the August Meeting. Funding from the state totals \$12,500,000 for this project.
- 6. **Health Department Lease** The current lease expired June 30, 2022. Inflation has increased 38.9% since 2007. Current lease is \$11,550 annually (\$962.50 per month). Notified the Health Department they are month to month until a new lease is negotiated. The Health Department continues to work on a new Lease.
- 7. **Planning Commission** continues their review of the proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment addressing "Accessory Apartments" (Guest House), Alternative Energy Sources (Solar, Wind, etc.), and Updating the Counties Comprehensive Plan. Any comments or questions let me know. Will resume meeting in February.
- 8. **Johns Creek Dam No.1** Received notification that federal funding, along with the State (Local) matching funds has been approved. No County funds needed. No Updates Available.
- 9. Landfill Fencing in the remaining property is being reviewed.

Mr. Matyas addressed the Board and Public regarding Father's Day.

HEAR THE PUBLIC

Mr. Spence opened Hear the Public.

Todd Price, Oriskany. Mr. Price commented on the Rails to Trails project. His concerns, during hunting season and loss of revenue for the County.

Vickie Graham, Oriskany. She requested information from VDOT regarding rails to trails that had shared pedestrian and vehicular traffic. She is concerned.

Ruth Sellers, Route 817 Oriskany. Concerned about shared roads and condition of roads. She is also concerned about the cost of the trail.

Jim Kern, Criag Creek Rd, Craig County. Speaking on behalf of the silent majority that are in support of the trail. Speaking about the decline of population and lack of young people/families in Eagle Rock. The burden on young families will be huge if there are no schools. Rails to Trails throughout the country have been popular and have had a profound impact on community health. People who travel to use these recreation trails are precisely the people and families you want to come to our community. Breathe a little bit of life back into New Castle and Eagle Rock Community.

Burke May, New Castle, Mr. May is not in support of the trail. Does not think it will benefit our community. He is concerned about the trash and taxes being raised to pay for the tail and maintenance of the trail.
