Mowing and brush trimming on Route 628 (Little Mountain Rd) is almost completed. Route 629 (Northside Rd) to follow. Shoulder and ditch maintenance on Route 624 (Little Mountain Road). Secondary Six Year Plan, organize early this year. Completed projects: Snow showers and wind events tree cleanup county wide. Patching on Route 42 (Cumberland Gap Road/Main Street) and Rout 625 (Sugar Maple Rd). Should repair on Route 615 (Craig Creek Rd / Market Street). Will be working on snow removal county wide with the approaching storm. Expecting snow, we are aware and will staff accordingly.
- B. Trace Bellassai, Broadband- No Report
- C. Bill Wolf, Preserve Craig, Mountain Valley Pipeline Update- No Report
- D. Woody Lipps, Craig Valley Railbed Trail The VDOT briefing in November covered the overall survey results. These results are now posted on the VDOT project website. More important than how many oppose or favor the trail are the specific concerns, ideas, and suggestions received. VDOT is in the process of analyzing these comments and they will be used in the specific design of the trail. A detailed look at the concerns expressed suggest a fear that the trail will attract a volume of visitors that will be allowed to run amuck with no management and no maintenance of the facility. If the trail is to benefit our community then there has to be a management plan and a commitment to implementation of the plan. Similar trails elsewhere are successful, not because they were built, but because they are well managed. Timeline remains the same:
 - Now until Spring of 2024, environmental and cultural resource inventory and documentation.
 - Spring/early summer of 2024, public review and public hearing on draft environmental documentation
 - Summer of 2024 the focus will be on the specific design work with final design around Fall 2025.

A management plan for the trail:

Our committee will be working on recommendations for management and maintenance of the trail if it is built. This plan development will go along with development of the specific design of the facility. Public input received so far, along with additional input, will be used in both the design and management plan development. Our committee is also advocating for specific conversations between adjacent land owners and VDOT in the design of the

trail. These one-on-one conversations are the best way for residents to have input and to better understand what the trail will actually look like where it will be adjacent to their property. Both the design and future management of the trail must focus not only on physical maintenance of the trail, but more importantly, the maintenance of relationships between the trail and our community. Similar trails are successful in many other places and there is no particular reason for our community to be any different. The trail proposal is an opportunity. The question remains how do we and can we make the most of this opportunity with the least amount of cost? We know we can't depend on the volunteer efforts alone to cover the maintenance on the trail until it gets built. But a volunteer component is most critical for a whole host of reasons. Mr. Lipps spoke of a group in Roanoke Pathfinders for Greenway, a well-trained, experienced, and organized group. Mr. Lipps thanked the Board for their time. Mr. Spence Thanked Mr. Lipps for his hard work.

REPORTS AND INQUIRIES FROM THE BOARD

- 1. **EDA Farmers Market Project (\$174,701.02)** for Phase One was completed on time and on budget. Management Items remaining:
 - a. Management Agreement to be developed by the EDA.
 - i. Identify who will manage the Farmers Market.
 - b. Farmers Market Committee has been established.
 - i. Tourism Commission has appointed a FM Committee to get started.
 - ii. Identify members (5-7) that are familiar with, or associated with farming, etc.
 - 1. Supervisor Matyas is a participating member.
 - iii. Identify additional types of activities (i.e., Christmas, Fall Festival, Music, etc.)
 - c. FM Policy is being developed, using Salem & Vinton Policies as a templet.
 - i. Final Draft will be presented to the EDA, then Town of New Castle, & the County for review and final approval.
 - d. Identify all Funding sources.
 - e. Develop Annual Operating Budget
 - f. Phase Two Options (Restroom Estimated cost = \$135,000)
- 2. **EDA** Following the November Elections there will be two vacancies. The BOS reviewed Nominations, in closed session, at the September BOS meeting, and has identified two candidates. Appointments at the December meeting, effective January 1, 2023.
- **3.** Courthouse Gazebo DAR, VA250 Craig Committee and the Tourism Commission are discussing plans for a commemorative Gazebo as part of the VA250 Anniversary Celebration in 2026. Identifying fund participants and fund-raising activities. This will be reviewed during Budget Work Sessions.

- 4. The Planning Commission will begin work on reviewing Solar Energy, Camping, Mother-in-law Houses as possible amendments to the Zoning Ordinance will begin March / April 2024.
- 5. **ARAP Funds** (Approximately \$996,637+/-) are eligible for Radio project. In addition, Delegate Terry Austin reports that there may be \$2,000,000 in proposed funding in the State Budget. We have also submitted a BRIC grant request for \$3,900,000.
- 6. Opioid Settlement Notified that the County will receive \$371,000. An eligible expense is assisting with the funding of the Catawba Hospital expansion currently being considered by the State Legislature. The BOS mailed, a <u>letter of support</u> for the Grant Application by the Roanoke Valley Response Cooperative to the Commonwealth of Virginia Opioid Abatement Authority last June,
- 7. 2024 Reassessment –Wampler Eanes Appraisal Group LTD has been working on the reassessments for the last few months roughly 100% of all parcels have been assessed. Over the last 6 years, property values have increased in value by an average of 34.5%.

During the Month of November there were 439 parcels appealed out of 5,313 total parcels (8.3%)

Of those parcel appeals:

- 293 parcels had changes (66.7% of Parcels Requesting Appeals).
- 146 parcels had no changes.
- There were 142 hearings scheduled and 10 walk-in hearings for a total of 152.
- There were 41 appeals from property owners that only appealed with no hearings requested.
- Spring of 2024 Board of Equalization will advertise dates for Individual Appointments.
- 8. Rails To Trails —A Citizen Information Meeting (CIM) was held on September 21, 2023 from 4:00PM to 6:00PM in the Craig County High School. Citizen Trail Survey results: Support 83.14%; Oppose 16.49%. The next step is the Preliminary Engineering work. CTB provided \$1,000,000 for PE work at their October Meeting. The Board appointed a 7-member committee at the June 2022 Meeting to oversee the development and ensure citizen involvement. Funding from the state totals \$12,500,000 for this project.
- 9. **Health Department Lease** The current lease expired June 30, 2022. Notified the Health Department they are month to month until a new lease is negotiated. The Health Department continues to work on a new Lease.

Mr. Spence asked if there were any more inquiries for the board.

Mr. Labiosa commented that he is excited to be here and in the next meeting would like to speak on the Public Service Authority and Discharge of Fire Arms in the county specifically in Residential areas.

Mr. Collins and Mr. Spence discussed areas in the Rural Residential area and residential districts regarding discharging firearms. The board discussed additional information to be added to the ordinance §30-2 Discharge of Firearms. The board also discussed repealing the ordinance. Mr. Collins will update at the next meeting.

Mr. Matyas would like some information regarding programs in neighboring counties, for relief for Farmland and other relief programs the county has in place.

HEAR THE PUBLIC

Mr. Zimmerman, 406 Hunters Drive, Owner of Zimmermans Equipment- Mr. Zimmerman commented on the Merchants Capital Tax. Mr. Zimmermans commented that there are not that many retail stores and he has high ticket items with small margins. The products are going to farmers who are struggling, and he does not pass the tax on to his customers. Mr. Zimmerman employs six people and cannot write a check to pay the taxes. It is not sustainable from his point of view. He has asked that during the budget please consider the merchant tax and abolish it. He thanks the board for their time.

Mr. Allen Luga, 562 Sinking Springs Hollow – Mr. Lugar would like the county to accept responsibility for the erosion of his property. Mr. Lugar listed his issues that have not been addressed. He supplied paperwork of his grievances to the board. Mr. Spence commented that the Board is not able to help with his issue but thanked him for letting them know. Mr. Lugar thanked the board for their time.

Regina Stahl, 8359 Peaceful Valley Rd – She is here regarding a ordinance violation of multiple cars on the property. The property is not zoned for an automobile lot. She gave a brief history regarding the property and is concerned that the oils/mercury switches/contamination draining to the creek. Mr. Collins gave an update on the violation and said the property owner will have them removed in 30 days.

Timeline remains the same:

- Now until Spring of 2024, environmental and cultural resource inventory and documentation.
- Spring/early summer of 2024, public review and public hearing on draft environmental documentation
- Summer of 2024 the focus will be on the specific design work with final design around Fall 2025.

Geographic Information:

Extension of the trail from the school to the county line involves 8.8 miles of railroad bed.

- 1.2 miles of this is currently state secondary road. (Alleghany Circle, Old Railroad Ave., Mill Cr. Ln.)
- 64 private landowners adjoin this section of railroad bed in Craig County.
- 4 government agencies own land adjacent, (School System, PSA, EDA, and US Forest Service)
- 22, of the total 68 landowners. adjoin the railroad bed where it is now a state secondary road.
- 12 residents either cross, or use part of the rail bed for primary access.
- 6 farm roads cross, or use sections of the rail bed.
- 14 homes are within about 100 feet of the edge of the state owned corridor.
- 4 additional homes are immediately adjacent to the edge of the state owned corridor.

The state owned corridor is a minimum of 100 feet wide in Craig County, up to 200 feet in one section.

There are 2 railroad bridges in Craig County. (Barbours Creek and Mill Creek)

Along our existing 1 mile trail there are 5 adjacent landowners, 2 homes immediately adjacent, and 3 farm road crossings.

These numbers are approximate. Derived from the study of GIS, Google Earth, VDOT maps, and field observations.

Craig County allocates \$775,000.00

Craig allocates money up front and the state reimburses monthly between 67% to 70% for most expenses minus the Medicaid reimbursement portion.

CSA can take referrals from: DJJ, DSS, Craig Schools, BRBH (Craig's Community Service Board), and individual parents in the community.

FAPT makes recommendations for services and CPMT approves the cost

Where the money is Going:

I. Private Day Centers is roughly 82% of the CSA budget
Currently we have 9 students are in private day schools
Average cost of private day school placement is \$6,000.00 a month per child
The majority of FY23 we only had 1 to 2 children in private day schools

- 2. Foster care Currently we have 9 children in foster care that is funded through CSA.
- -Decisions to place children in foster care is not made by CSA

Whereas, the Craig County Board of Supervisors (The Board) is responsible for the health, safety, and welfare of the Citizens of the County of Craig; and

Whereas, the Craig County - New Castle Public Service Authority (PSA) currently faces two major challenges related to its drinking water system, which are crucial for the health and safety of the community; and

Whereas, the first challenge involves the refurbishment of the existing water tower, including. the painting of its interior, a project necessitated by the requirements of the Virginia Department of Health, with the lowest quote for this refurbishment being approximately \$119,000; and

Whereas, the second challenge is the long-standing need, since the 1980s, to construct an additional water tower for redundancy, to ensure regulatory compliance with state mandated. chlorine contact time, a project currently estimated at \$1.9 million; and

Whereas, the lack of this additional water tower affects various parts of the PSA's system, including the school system, by not meeting the required minimum contact time with chlorine as established by state regulations; and

Whereas, the PSA has the necessary land and shovel-ready designs for the additional water tower, yet lacks sufficient financial resources to commence this vital project; and

Whereas, the PSA operates with a general operating fund of no more than \$150,000, and neither Craig County nor New Castle are in a financial position to provide significant assistance for these crucial projects.

Therefore, Be it Resolved, that the Craig County Board of Supervisors hereby formally requests support from relevant state officials for a state budget amendment that would provide necessary funding for these mandated drinking water projects.

Be it Further Resolved that this resolution reflects the urgent need for state intervention and support to ensure the health, safety, and well-being of the County of Craig community and its compliance with state regulatory requirements.

WHEREAS, by Deed, dated June 26, 2018, recorded as Instrument No. 180000370, Craig County Circuit Court Clerk's Office, the Broyles conveyed the Property to Douglas G. Williams and Jessie Williams; and

WHEREAS, the County and Douglas G. Williams and Jessie Williams now desire to amend and modify the Agreement as hereinafter set forth in the Amendment; and

WHEREAS, both parties wish to have this Amendment recorded in the Craig County Circuit Court Clerk's Office.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Craig County, in a regular meeting on the 1st day of February 2024, do approve this Amendment; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Craig County Board of Supervisors authorizes the County Administrator to execute any and all documents associated with the "Amendment" and it's recordation in the Craig County Circuit Court Clerk's Office.

AMENDMENTS to Oct. 14, 2009 Tower Site Lease Agreement The parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Easement.</u> The next to last sentence of Section 2. of the Agreement is amended to state as follows: "Upon 24-hour advance notice to Landlord, Tenant and its employees, agents, and subcontractors, will have pedestrian and vehicular access over the Property from State Route 622 to the Premises for routine tower and equipment maintenance and repair; provided, however, that in the event of an emergency as reasonably determined by Tenant, Tenant may have pedestrian and vehicular access over the Property from State Route 622 to the Premises without providing prior notice."
- 2. Road Maintenance and Construction. 



VACo Opposes Legislation Mandating Localities to Approve Utility-Scale Solar and Battery Storage Facilities

January 25, 2024



SB 697 (Van Valkenburg) (https://lis.virginia.gov/cgi-bin/legp604.exe? ses=241&typ=bil&val=sb697) requires localities to permit utility-scale solar and energy storage facilities as a "special exception" per 15.2-2288.8 (https://law.lis.virginia.gov/vacode/15.2-2288.8/) of Virginia Code and to develop an ordinance that establishes "reasonable criteria and requirements" for the siting of utility-scale solar and battery storage projects. Additionally, the legislation states that such reasonable criteria and requirements "...shall not include limits on the total amount, density, or size of solar and storage facilities that can be developed."

The legislation effectively requires counties to permit any application, regardless of the cumulative impact of such facilities, so long as the requirements of a local ordinance with "reasonable" criteria are met.

- Utility-scale solar and battery storage are in effect largescale power plants, many of which may have oversized footprints. For example, a solar facility with a generating capacity of 100 MW can occupy 1,000 acres or more of land.
- The state should not require counties to permit these facilities, regardless

Sticker shock: Franklin County homes up 55% in value in reassessment

ROCKY MOUNT — Franklin County property owners may want to brace themselves as they check their mailboxes in the coming weeks.

Reassessment letters will soon be making their way out with residential home valuations in the county expected to increase by 55% on average.

County supervisors were given the update Tuesday from the Wampler-Eanes Appraisal Group, which has overseen reassessments in the county for nearly 20 years. Company staff have visited homes over the past few months to get an idea of each property's fair market value.

State law requires localities with more than 50,000 residents to perform reassessments every four years. Some localities have opted to have reassessments done more often to prevent the massive increases, like the one that has hit Franklin County properties this year.

Franklin County's last reassessment was performed in 2020, just before the housing market heated up nationwide as well as locally. Starting that year, home sales in the county saw a massive jump with a limited supply available mixed with high demand.

"I'm not seeing any evidence that the market is stalling," said Agnew Stathos, lead appraiser for the Wampler-Eanes Appraisal Group. "So we still have an inventory issue."

In addition to residential homes expected to see a 55% increase in assessed value on average, supervisors were told multifamily homes should expect a 26% increase, commercial property a 16% increase, land between 20 and 90 acres is up

18% and land more than 100 acres is up 19%. Gary Eanes, owner of Wampler-Eanes Appraisal Group, cautioned that those averages could change as they work to finalize assessments in the next few weeks.

Overall, the county is expected to see a 47% increase in property values in all categories, according to Eanes.

Stathos gave multiple examples of increased home values throughout the county. The more expensive lakefront homes at Smith Mountain Lake saw their average sale price increase from \$569,000 in 2019 to \$978,000 in 2023. Elsewhere in the county, the average home price increased from \$196,000 in 2019 to \$299,000 in 2023.

"This is going to be a challenge. This is going to be sticker shock for our citizens when they see these reassessments come in the mail," said Blue Ridge District representative Tim Tatum. "We know we have got to roll up our sleeves and make reasonable adjustments."

Several neighboring localities have lowered their real estate tax rate to lessen the burden of the increased property assessments. Franklin County's current rate stands at 61 cents per every \$100 of assessed value, one of the lowest in the region.

There was no discussion by supervisors Tuesday concerning any possible reduction in the county's real estate tax rate. Based on current estimates, supervisors would have to lower the rate by as much as 20 cents.

Supervisors traditionally propose any changes to the county's real estate tax rate during budget discussions in March. A public hearing would be required by state law this year, even if the real estate tax rate remains the same, due to reassessments resulting in an increase of 1% or more in the total of real property tax levied.
